

DID YOU KNOW

There are 9,119 fewer priests since 2000. There are 3,363 parishes in 2018 without a resident pastor. There are an average of 477 ordinations per year the last 20 years. One seminarian is needed from EACH parish to reverse the priest shortage.

NATIONAL VOCATION AWARENESS WEEK

November 3rd is the beginning of the US Church's observation of Vocation Awareness Week. The growing clergy shortage means that priestly presence is waning in many Catholic institutions, especially high schools and colleges. Please keep all of our departed family and friends in your prayers who recently passed away, especially Sam Falbo and Richard Brennan.


