LOVING SELF-SACRIFICE

Abraham would be arrested for child abuse if he pulled a stunt like this today. He brought his son up a hill and raised a knife to kill him. No parent should do that.

We remember this story not as a model of parenting, but as a symbol of sacrifice. Both Abraham and God serve as models.

Abraham completely trusted God. God promised him a son, and Isaac was born after Abraham waited one hundred years. Then God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son, Isaac, his only son, the one whom he loved. Abraham continued to trust God. His trust is what inspires us in times of extreme adversity.

The story also symbolizes God's love. God led his son, Jesus, his only Son, whom he loved, up a hill, where he was raised on a cross. In the story of Abraham, an angel stopped the killing. In the story of Jesus, the killing continues, but angels announce that the One who died has risen.

Some of our hardest choices concern children we love. We would never harm them physically, but sometimes we inconvenience them, disagree with them, or punish them for the sake of a greater good. We love God more than anyone or anything else.

LENTE FASTING GUIDELINES

Fasting means eating only one full meal with two smaller meals that do not equal the full meal (for those between the ages of 18-59). Abstinence means to not eat meat (for those ages 14 and older). All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Good Friday is a day of Fast and Abstinence.

2020 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MAILED

The parish financial statements were mailed on Tuesday, January 19th. Due to Covid19, mailing the statements is a safer procedure. Please keep in mind that only those who have contributed \$500.00 or more will receive a statement. This is what has been done over the last years at Saint Ann. Nothing has changed this year except they were mailed to your home. If you have given less and would like a statement, you will need to call the parish office and request one. 2021 MASS INTENTIONS

There are several openings available in 2021 to remember or honor your loved ones through a mass intention. Just send your request to St. Ann of the Dunes, P O Box 727, Beverly Shores, 46301. Right now, openings are available for the Saturday evening mass at 6:00 pm only. We will do our best to accommodate your requested date. Please leave a phone number we can contact you at in case of questions. The suggested donation to request a mass in memory or to honor your loved one is \$10.00. SACRAMENTAL POLICIES

Baptism - Those requesting Baptism (for their children) must be registered and attending the Parish for mass at least six months prior to the request. There is a formation meeting before a date can be scheduled for the Baptism.

GodParents/Sponsors - In order to serve in either of these roles one must be a practicing Catholic who has been Confirmed and if married, your marriage must have taken place before a Catholic Priest (or deacon). A Practicing Catholic is one who is registered in the Parish and attends Mass on a regular basis.

Wedding - Couples requesting a Wedding must be registered and practicing their Faith by attending Mass for at least a year before a date can be reserved. There are Pre-Cana classes as well as several appointments with the Pastor that are required. Please contact the Parish a year in advance.

SAVE A SEAT TO ATTEND MASS

In order to comply with current COVID-19 restrictions while allowing the faithful the opportunity to attend Mass, you must sign up through Save-A-Seat. To reserve a seat at St. Ann's Mass, go to <https://www.stpatparish.org/website>-St. Patrick's Church-Chesterton and scroll down to find the select button for St. Ann's. Enter your first and last names, your email address, your phone number and the number of adults and children that would like to attend. Check the box that says you have read and understand the general release. Double check to make sure your information is accurate. Then click the "reserve seat" button. A confirmation email will be sent to the email address you entered. Please make sure that you bring this confirmation email with you to Mass. If you do not have this confirmation, you cannot be admitted to Mass. A facemask is required. If you have been sick over the last 14 days, have a fever or a cough, please stay at home. If symptoms occur, please cancel your reservation. Please be considerate for everyone's safety.
